2024-2025 Preschool Registration

Registration will be done through SignUpGenius. There is a \$50.00 non-refundable registration fee plus a nominal service fee charged by SignUpGenius.

Tuition is payable in five equal installments due May, September, November, January and March. Please note that the 1st tuition payment is due on or before May 1, 2024. This is a **non-refundable** payment.

A 10% discount for siblings or active St. Andrew's members will be applied to the final tuition payment.

The school year begins the week of September 9th and ends the week of June 9th.

TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN: Children must be 5 years old by October 1, 2024.

Children will need a lunch and drink daily.

- ✓ Provides the extra needed time that some children require for growth and maturation in any one or more of the following developmental areas: intellectual, emotional, social or physical.
- ✓ Emphasizes exploration and skill building in the fields of reading readiness, math, science, fine and gross motor activities, music and art.
- ✓ The goal of the class is to reinforce the skills needed for a successful transition to kindergarten.
- ✓ Afternoons provide enrichment activities promoting the development of positive self-esteem and social growth.
- ✓ Fifth day is a dedicated STEM Day, introducing concepts of prediction, reasoning and discovery as well as exploring the natural world of science with an opportunity to take part in multi-sensory experiences and scientific experiments.

FOUR YEAR OLD CLASSES: Children must be 4 years old by October 1, 2024.

THREE YEAR OLD CLASSES: Children must be 3 years old by October 1, 2024.

- ✓ Literacy Lab is dedicated to introducing and reinforcing letters and other early literacy skills in a fun and engaging way. Children explore and become more familiar with print and print-related activities. These days extend the preschool experience with an emphasis on listening to and talking about stories.
